Hearty sides include roasted fingerling potatoes, crisp green beans tossed in butter and toasted almonds, and creamy mashed potatoes with carrots. A beet salad, a warm barley and walnut dish, and soft, freshly baked buns made with local flour and butter round out the meal. Classic turkey stuffing and tangy cranberry sauce.

Desserts

A rich haskap berry cake and a spiced haskap apple pie capture the flavours of the season. A moist rhubarb cake topped with lightly whipped cream adds a touch of tartness and nostalgia. Finally, a smooth chocolate mousse made with fresh local eggs.




